2. Mirror Their Emotions

Reflect the listener's feelings through the story's characters to build rapport and empathy.

3. Embed Commands

Subtly suggest actions or emotions within the narrative:

- "He couldn't help but feel drawn to the light."
- "She realized she was ready to embrace something new."

4. Use Open Loops

Leave part of the story unresolved, creating curiosity and keeping the listener's mind engaged. For example:

"And as the garden began to bloom, she discovered something she hadn't expected... but that's a story for another time."
